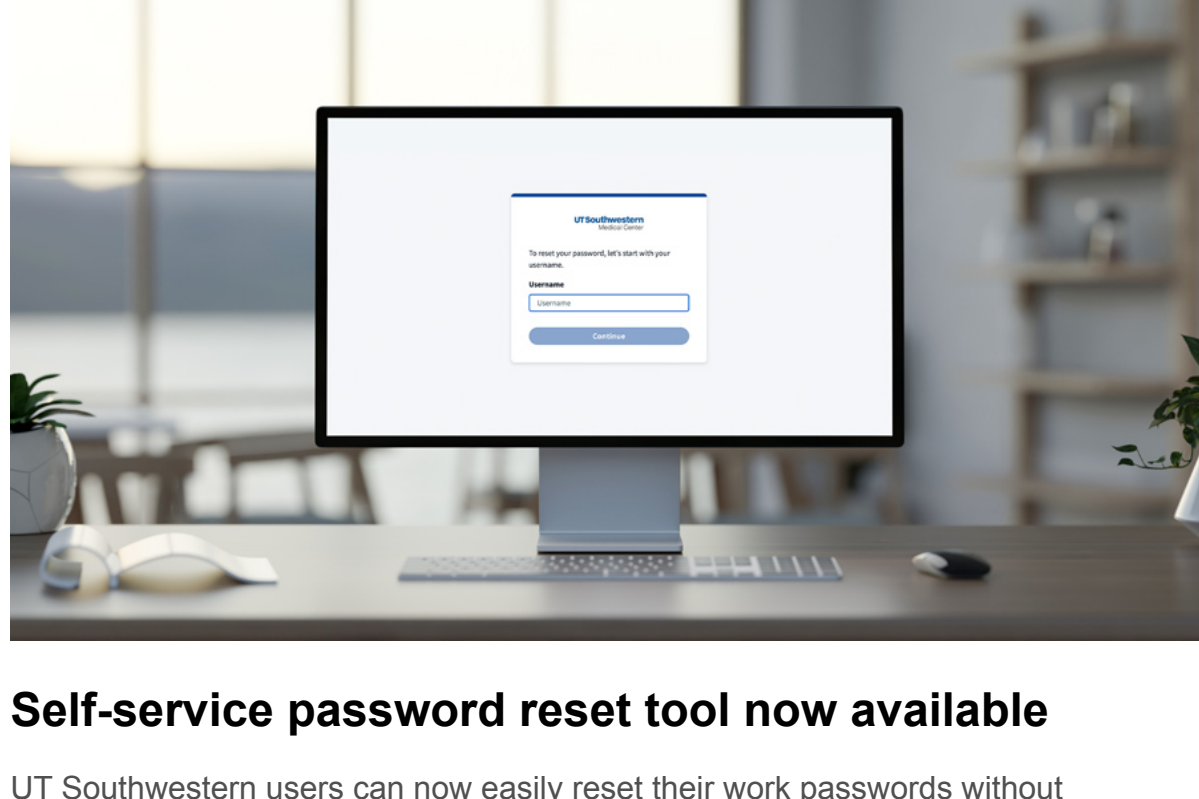




Self-service password reset tool now available

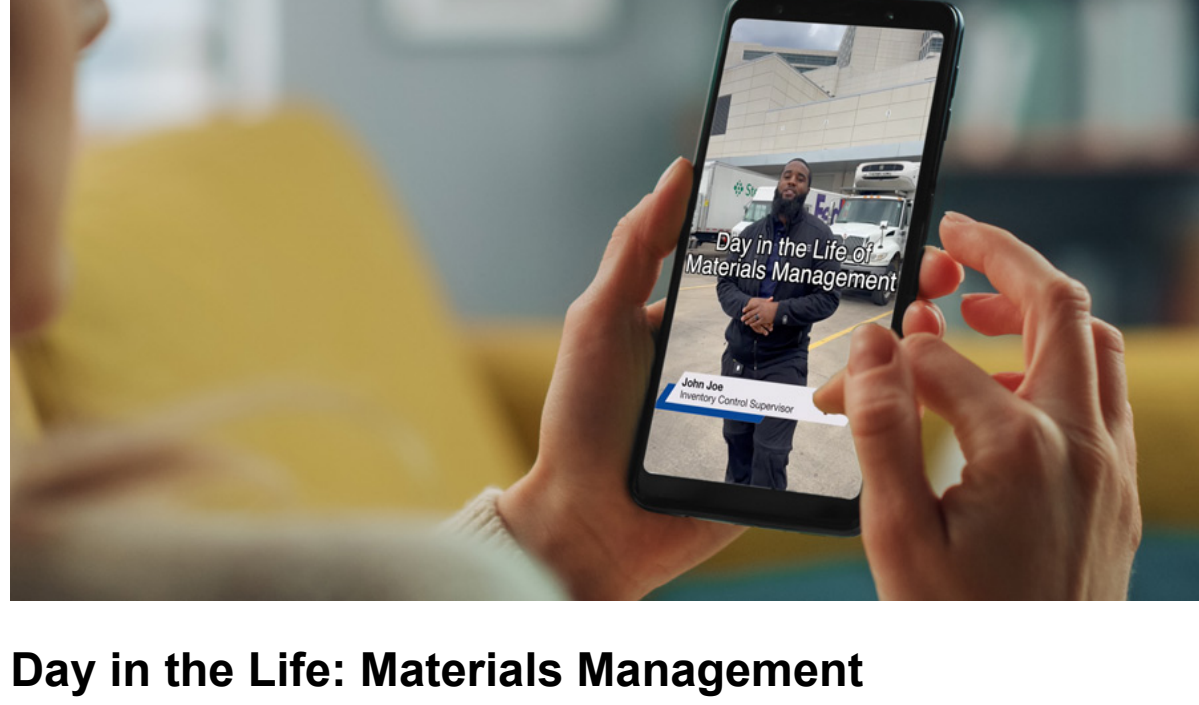


Celebrating science, success, and the future

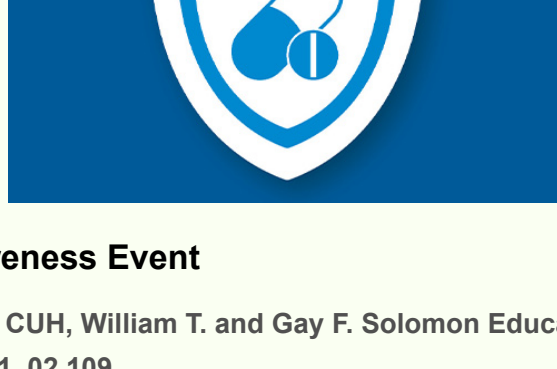

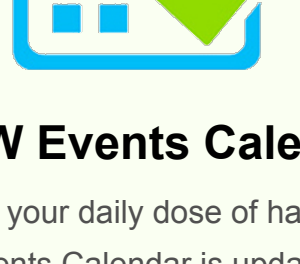


Opioid Safety Awareness Event
